Discussion
<ul> <li>When the amended flexibility letter was read, it did not include several amendments listed on similar November 3 update that is on the NC DHHS website. One appears to be for TBI and one for Innovations. Are there two different sets of amendments?</li> <li>Live-in adult family members (NOT JUST PARENTS) need to be allowed to be RADSE for both minor and adult waiver recipients. The staffing shortages are not going yo get better.</li> <li>Staffing is extremely difficult to find, and with children with profound needs, very few people are able, willing, and qualified to care for them. Our adult family members are one of the best resources we have, so why take that away?</li> <li>And what do we do on Saturday if we have no reply from CMS? Some will have almost no staffing left if the flexibilities are not continued, and no options to find more, some have been looking for months, and when they have no staff, they cannot work.</li> <li>Some understand IDD/TBI get the most attention because of their unique complications and the caregiver/parents are most vocal and engaged, however, there are many with MH/SUD. Are they being considered in all these changes to strengthen their access to care?</li> <li>In Johnston County, their local health dept. provides services instead of going to Alliance MCO offices. It works well. Most counties have health depts. Can we look at what is working in Johnston to bring to other county health depts?</li> <li>Some searched the DHHS website including DHB and didn't see the new map with the LME catchment areas/ counties listed. Is there a map update yet? If yes, the sooner put online the better. * As soon as Stacey gets the map she will send it – once it is blessed.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>There was time to address the amendments that will be put in place at that time. There are many issues not addressed</li> </ul>

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		<ul> <li>about EORs and RADSE and still a lack of clarity on how some of these things work out in real life. Most EORs believe that there should be several more amendments made permanent from Appendix K.</li> <li>As an EOR stated, "We are being given direction the 11<sup>th</sup> hour of the 11<sup>th</sup>." Their concerns are not going away. An extension until February is no doubt helpful, but more discussion and advocacy is needed for long-term changes to the waiver to address extreme staffing shortages.</li> <li>Our state model does allow for choice of providers. More important.</li> <li>There's a strong intent to elevate EOR concerns through the proposed EOR meeting with Lacosta Parker to be set up soon to address concerns that are fully discussed.</li> <li>To clarify, the understanding is that RADSE will potentially end entirely for minor children. The NCDHHS list of recommendations for flexibilities to be made permanent at times includes parents being allowed to function as RADSE for minor children. And then at times, it is not included in the list.</li> <li>Is there an EOR state stakeholder committee?</li> <li>Where can we find the DHHS reimbursement rates for services so we can compare them to the rates set by the MCOs?</li> </ul>

Kinsley provided LME/MCO Consolidations Update – In deciding how to best reduce the number of MCOs, he solicited input from consumers and beneficiaries, providers, county leadership, associations, and MCO leadership.</li> <li>The realignment is to be taken immediately to ensure the expeditious launch of tailored plans and to minimize duplication work, such as transferring assets and other efforts related to multiple consolidations. and based his decision on three primary criteria:</li> <li>What is best for the people we serve and for the providers who deliver services?</li> <li>What will promote the value of whole-person care and move us to Tailored Plans faster?</li> <li>What will promote the value of whole-person care and move us to Tailored Plans faster?</li> <li>What will reduce complexity, create less disruption, and make things easier for everyone involved?</li> <li>Secretarial Directive (11/1)</li> <li>Sandhills Center will be dissolved and Eastpointe will be the surviving entity with all counties in the Sandhills Center catchment area aligned to Eastpointe except 3 counties.</li> <li>Eastpointe shall consolidate with Trillium. A consolidation agreement should be crafted by the parties and presented to the Dept. for consultation NLT 30 days from the date of the Directive.</li> <li>Will there be an introductory meeting between participants/ families and Trillium with the consolidation? How are they doing with promoting services to members? Do they provide any reports?</li> <li>How can we be included and updated on the process of the TBI waiver going statewide? As asked for in SCFAC's letter.</li> <li>Do we direct TBI questions to Ginger Yarbrough?</li> <li>Will all 4 waivers be under Tailored Plans?</li> <li>Does legislation still give the LME/MCOs 4 years of exclusivity in managing TPs? What happens after 4 years?</li> <li>Many are very worried about to many changes occurring at the same time. There is not enough staff at any level to ensure things will be smooth.</li> <li>There are not enough LME/MCO staff in local areas for individuals to reach out to. People are still after all this time not familiar with who to call for services. In many cases they are reaching out to people 4 hours or more away and we all know trust is a big factor. We trust people in our communities that we can see face to face no having to call a number and punch buttons.</li> </ul>
