## SUBJECT: CHILD WELFARE – SECONDARY TRAUMATIC STRESS LEARNING COMMUNITIES

**Purpose**: The North Carolina Division of Social Services (NC DSS), along with the Center for Child & Family Health (CCFH) hosted seven (7) regional listening sessions in January 2024, to gain an understanding of the impact of job stress on our current child welfare workforce – including secondary traumatic stress (STS) and the current well-being needs of our child welfare workers. During the STS Input Sessions, many child welfare staff reported the importance of peer support in the workplace as well as a desire for increased resources to address STS. In response to the feedback gathered, NC DSS –through CCFH –is hosting a year-long series of topic-based collaborative sessions. These sessions, referred to as *Child Welfare - Secondary Traumatic Stress Learning Communities*, have been designed to normalize addressing STS and share successful strategies used across North Carolina Child Welfare workers. These sessions will also provide additional support and resources for those who are impacted by Hurricane Helene or who are providing support to others impacted by the storms.

The aims of STS Learning Community collaborative sessions are to: (1) cultivate peer support, (2) provide a dedicated shared learning space focused on STS, and (3) examine effective practices and strategies for improving workforce wellness and resilience. The 60-minute STS call sessions are offered monthly, primarily for child welfare supervisors and their frontline staff, and purposely facilitated by non-state STS experts. The calls have been organized by position and region, with one call each for front-line workers and supervisors in the Eastern, Central, and Western parts of North Carolina. Time in each call is set aside for structured learning, sharing, and skill practice on topics such as" Developing *a Proactive Approach to STS*", "*Processing STS At Work*", and "*Personalized Approaches to STS Reduction*".
