# Problem Analysis

## A. PROBLEM STATEMENT (>10 minutes)

1. What is the most pressing or difficult problem or challenge currently facing you in your work that:
  - is related to a focus area or strategy included in the NC Opioid Action Plan
  - is a problem you have been struggling with and has no known or clear solution;
  - is a problem that you are involved in or that implicates you/your organization;
  - is a complex problem that requires the coordination or input of multiple organizations or levels of work beyond your immediate scope;
  - People could have multiple opinions or disagree about the solution to the problem; and,
  - It is important to you (and/or your organization) to find a solution *soon*.

***State the problem/project in the form of a question.***

2. What is the background to this problem? Note significant, relevant events that led to it.
3. Who are the key stakeholders? What is your/your organization's role?
4. What are the constraints you must consider in coming to a solution? (Time, resources, scope, attitudes, power, personalities, structure, etc.)
5. What solutions have you already tried and how did they turn out?
