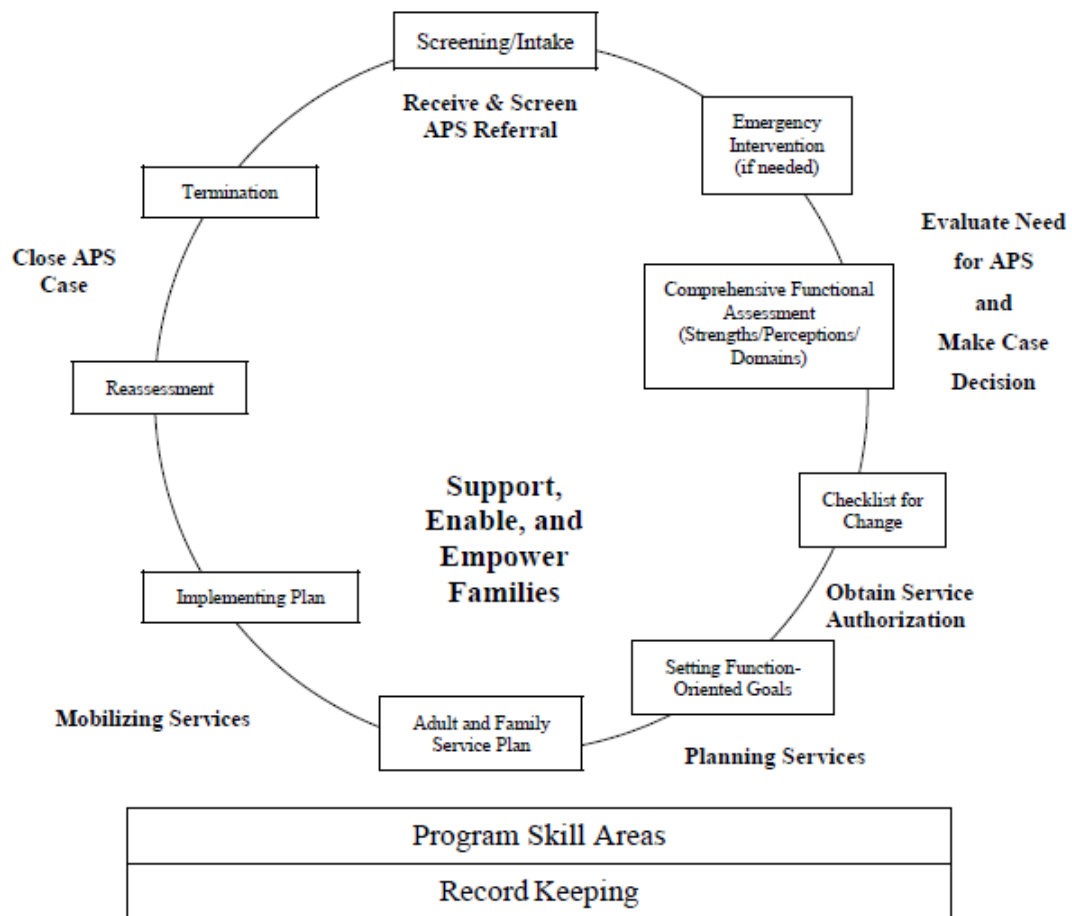

1. A prompt and thorough evaluation to determine whether the disabled adult is in need of APS is the responsibility of the director of the DSS.		
2. The evaluation must determine whether or not the adult lacks the capacity to consent to protective services.		
3. After a report is accepted, an evaluation must be initiated within 24 hours for emergencies, and 48 hours for all others.		
4. If a disabled adult (with capacity) does not consent to protective services, the services can still be provided.		
5. After completing the evaluation the director has to notify the individual making the report of his determination as to whether the disabled adult needs protective services.		
6. An APS report (referral) may be made orally or in writing.		
7. A thorough assessment includes 8 functional areas.		
8. A petition for an order authorizing provision of protective services must allege that the disabled adult is in need of protective services and lacks the capacity to consent to protective services.		
9. It is not necessary for DSS to maintain a separate record or section of a record for information relevant to APS.		
10. Anyone who has reasonable cause to believe that a disabled adult is in need of APS must report that information to the director of DSS.
