Subject: Child Protective Services Central Registry Statistics for SFY 1999-2000

Attached are several reports derived from the Division's most recent statistics concerning child abuse, neglect, and dependency in North Carolina. These statistics are taken from the CPS Central Registry and are based on information entered into the Central Registry by all counties in North Carolina between July 1, 1999 and June 30, 2000.

These totals include children who are the subject of more than one investigative assessment during the state fiscal year. This duplicated data is a good measure of the workload of social workers. Unduplicated data is a better measure of the actual incidents of child maltreatment. Unduplicated counts of children can be found on the Children's Services web site at http://ChildrensServices.dhhs.state.nc.us/policy_and_planning/

The Division hopes that the information contained in these reports will be helpful to you. This information can be used to update your staff and community concerning the scope and nature of reports of child abuse, neglect, and dependency in you county and in the state.
