The North Carolina Infant-Toddler Program (NC ITP) <u>Policy and Procedures for Personnel Certification</u> applies to early intervention service coordination and special instruction service providers. Under this policy, continuing professional development is required for all Infant, Toddler, and Family Certificate holders. The annual continuing professional development requirement is 10 contact hours (1.0 CEU) per year, to be obtained between January 1 and December 31 of any given calendar year. Contact hours/CEU credits must focus on infants and toddlers with or without disabilities, and their families (this includes approved conferences and trainings focusing on diversity, equity, and inclusion). Contact hours must be obtained from an NC ITP-approved entity from the NC ITP <u>Continuing Professional Development Approved Entities</u> list.

Things to Remember:

- 1. When the NC ITP requires a training, taking an identical or similar training prior does not exempt you from taking the required training.
- 2. When viewing trainings from similar programs, keep in mind the differences in implementation of policies and procedures (e.g., other Part C Programs and Maternal, Infant, and Early Childhood Home Visiting Program).
- 3. Sessions taken from approved conferences must be related to infants and toddlers with or without disabilities, and their families.
- 4. Print out your certificate; do not rely on a site's database to store it.
- 5. If the approved source does not offer a certificate upon completion, the individual should attach the following to their <u>NC ITP</u> <u>Documentation of Continuing Professional Development form:</u>
 - a. Available slides, handouts, documents, and other training materials associated with the training;
 - b. A statement about how the training supports evidence-based practices for infants and toddlers; and
 - c. A write-up of how the learner will apply the information learned from the training in their work.
