There is no right or wrong way to feel in response to the trauma of a hurricane.

Counseling	Mobile Crisis teams are operating throughout the disaster area and can send trained clinicians to a home, community, or shelter to respond to an urgent need. To get connected, call Vaya Health at 1-800-849-6127.
Opioid treatment	Opioid treatment is available at emergency departments. Call 911 if you are experiencing an emergency. You may also visit Opioid Treatment Programs in your area. Find a real-time map with location, contact information and hours of operation at <u>thecentralregistry.com/map/</u> .
Medication	With some exceptions, pharmacists are allowed to dispense a one- time emergency supply of up to 90 days when they are unable to contact the medical provider, and a one-time emergency refill of up to a 30-day supply of the prescribed medication.
