Nationwide Infant Formula Shortage

- CACFP operators may have trouble finding formula
- Breastmilk or iron-fortified infant formula is required at all infant meals and snacks



How can CACFP Operators find formula?

- Consider a different formula than you normally buy
- Purchase only the formula that you need for the next 2 weeks
- Contact community organizations, reputable online retailers, distributors, and manufacturers
