Overview:

Since 2017, the Health Information Technology/Telehealth (HITT) program at the Office of Rural Health (ORH) diligently promotes, supports, and assists ORH grantees and safety net partners use of health information technology and telehealth to enhance healthcare access and delivery statewide.

HITT Initiatives

Appalachian Regional Commission (ARC) POWER Grant

With ARC funding and in partnership with the Department of Information Technology's Broadband Infrastructure Office (BIO), the HITT Program assesses telehealth infrastructure needs to tackle health disparities in North Carolina's ARC region.

Virtual Behavioral Health

The N.C. General Assembly appropriated State Fiscal Recovery Funds (SFRF) in Session Law 2021-180. Under this Session Law, Section 9B.8A.(a) established the creation of the competitive Virtual Behavioral Health Services Grant Program to expand telepsychiatry capacities to respond to the COVID-19 public health emergency.

Office of Digital Equity and Literacy

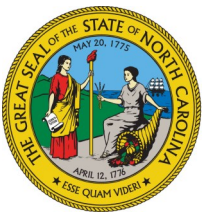
Through the NC Department of Information Technology's Office of Digital Equity and Literacy, funding offered via the NC Digital Equity Act, the HITT team is implementing a rural community centered digital capacity program to promote digital skills and knowledge of health language to reduce healthcare delivery gaps in underserved communities.

The NC DHHS HITT program has promoted the utilization of skilled Emergency Medical Services (EMS) professionals beyond their normal their normal emergency response and transport roles to serve as an extension of primary care delivery for medically underserved populations.



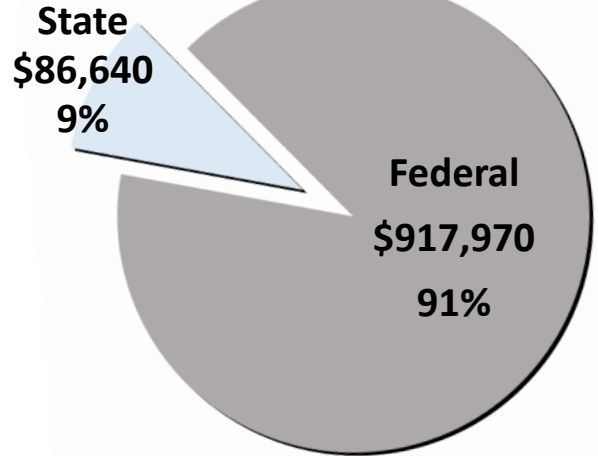

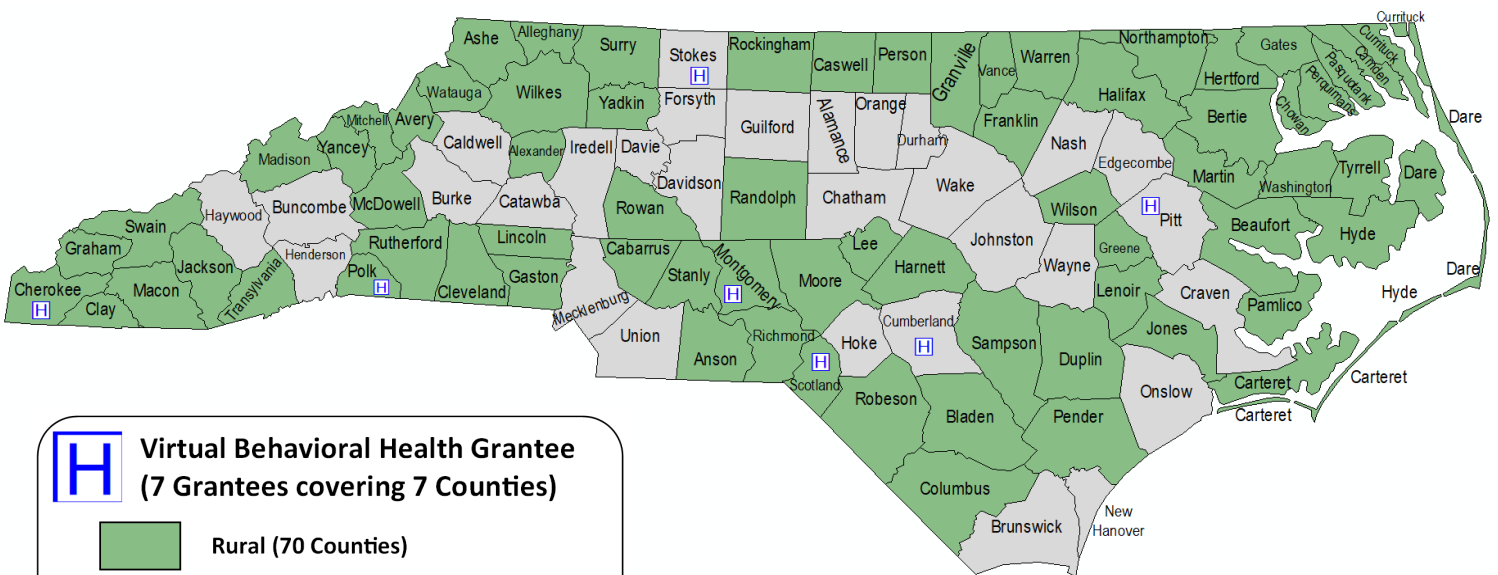
