About Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) Councils at DHHS

NCDHHS has established a network of DEI Councils in over twenty-five divisions, offices, and facilities to support localized diversity, equity, and inclusion efforts and provide guidance for work teams throughout the department.

A DEI Council:

- Is an advisory group of employees chartered by division leadership
- Is a **bridge** between leaders and staff
- Helps guide the division's DEI process
- Helps **change** the workplace to support diversity, equity, and inclusion
- Learns about the equity needs of staff and the overall organization
- Speaks up for and shares information with staff and leaders

The DEI Council Network includes:

- **Executive Sponsors**: Division, Office or Facility Director or Management-level Designee who connects the Council with the Division/Office leadership team, supports the Council goals and action plans and provides guidance.
- **Co-Chairs**: Lead, plan and organize Council efforts and connect with Division/Office leadership.
- **Council Members**: Meet regularly, champion DEI, develop and implement action plans, participate in training, and approve participation time.

NCDHHS' Priority for Diversity, Equity, & Inclusion

Why is DEI a priority for NCDHHS?

Everyone has a critical role to play in supporting DEI values, initiatives, and programming. We all serve as a cohesive unit at NCDHHS to offer equitable health services to North Carolinians.
