As authorized under section 12(1) of the Richard B. Russell National School Lunch Act, 42 U.S.C. 1760(1), FNS may waive provisions of such Act or the Child Nutrition Act of 1966, as amended, and the provisions of this part with respect to a State or eligible service provider. The provisions of this part required by other statutes may not be waived under this authority. FNS may only approve requests for a waiver that are submitted by a State Summer EBT agency and comply with the requirements at section 12(1)(1) and the limitations at section 12(1)(4), including that FNS may not grant a waiver that increases Federal costs.

As a result of North Carolina choosing to utilize the Nutri-Link Summer EBT application front-end offered by USDA, North Carolina must develop a back-end system to complete the eligibility processing, communicate with customers about their application, and generally act as a system of record for Summer EBT applications. Due to the amount of time needed to complete this back-end system, North Carolina is requesting waivers of the following Summer EBT requirements for the 2025 program year starting September 1, 2024:

Given the requirement to match with the NSLP data, Nutri-Link does not perform the complete eligibility determination and those "denied" by Nutri-Link due to income will not be provided a formal denial notice through Nutri-Link because it does not provide communication to applicants in any way; the system being developed to do this will not be complete until calendar year 2025 (target February / March) and formal notification of denied status for those applications received before this time cannot be completed until then.
7 CFR 292.13(f)	Timely certifications. Summer EBT agencies must follow-up with a household that submits an incomplete application within 10 operational days of receipt of the application.	As mentioned, the system that will perform eligibility determinations for applications taken in by Nutri-Link will not be ready until approximately February / March 2025; until then, North Carolina will not know which applications will require follow-up.

To meet the communication requirements to greatest degree possible through Nutri-Link while the back-end application eligibility system is being developed, North Carolina worked with Nutri-Link to utilize their application confirmation page that is presented to applicants upon submission of the application to provide them information on whether they passed the income requirement/categorically eligible, did not pass the income requirement and would therefore be denied, or have a household with mixed eligibility (occurs when household is over the income threshold but some children marked categorical eligibility). In all variations of the confirmation page, it is stated clearly that North Carolina must take additional action to determine eligibility and will provide the applicant with an eligibility determination notice once complete.

- ☑ Check to affirm that the waiver(s) will not increase the overall cost of the Summer EBT Program to the Federal Government. If there are anticipated increases, confirm that the costs will be paid from non-Federal funds.
- ☑ Check to affirm that the Summer EBT agency will monitor and review implementation of the waiver(s) and report on implementation as part of their 2025 iPOM. Reporting will include: a description of whether the waiver(s) resulted in improved services to recipients/participants; a description of the impact of the waiver(s) on providing benefits to participants; and a description of how the waiver(s) reduced the quantity of paperwork necessary to administer the Program.
