Is your child enrolled in Medicaid?

If so, they may be eligible for the new SUN Bucks food assistance program!



Beginning this summer, SUN Bucks will provide families with a one-time payment of \$120 in food assistance benefits per eligible child. Benefits will be issued on debit-like cards that can be used to buy healthy food at grocery stores, farmers markets, and some online retailers. SUN Bucks is a new program that will provide grocery-buying benefits to qualifying families with school-aged children during the summer months when schools are on summer break.

Who qualifies for SUN Bucks through Medicaid participation?

As a baseline requirement, a child must: 1) Have an active Medicaid case at any point between July 1, 2023 and August 31, 2024 **AND** 2) Have a household income at or below 185% of the Federal Poverty Line. **In addition to this**, the child must meet **at least one** of the following to automatically qualify for SUN Bucks:

- The child attends a school that participates in the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) or Community Eligibility Provision (CEP), OR
- The child is aged 7 to 16 years old at any time between July 1, 2023 August 31, 2024.

Children who automatically qualify do not need to complete a SUN Bucks application.

If a child does not automatically qualify for SUN Bucks through Medicaid, they may still be eligible. Visit www.ncdhhs.gov/sunbucks for more information and to see if the child qualifies. To find out if a school participates in NSLP or CEP, use the SUN Bucks 2024 School Search tool at www.ncdhhs.gov/sunbucks-schoolsearch.

When and how will benefits be issued?

SUN Bucks issuances will occur on a rolling basis from mid–June through September as new children are determined eligible.

Children who qualify for SUN Bucks through Medicaid will be mailed a SUN Bucks card to the address associated with their Medicaid case. There are two exceptions:

- If a child has both Medicaid and an active Food and Nutrition Services (FNS) case, their SUN Bucks benefits will be loaded onto their existing FNS card.
- If a child has Medicaid and is in foster care, a SUN Bucks card will be mailed to the child's county DSS office. The child's caseworker will help get the card to the child.
